The SME can offer guidance on how she would like to recognize his contribution (aside from sharing required copyright information).

5. Remove the link to Course FAQ there and mention that it can be found in Module 1 Resources.

Outside of that, it's okay to add the QUODLIBET Guide links in Resources.
